Dear Colleague

A hip fracture remains the commonest condition to cause an acute orthopaedic admission. With an increasingly elderly population the numbers of hip fractures continues to increase. It therefore falls within the remit of the orthopaedic surgeon to minimise the consequences of this injury and assist in a speedy return of the patient back home.

This meeting will concentrate on those aspects of treatment specifically relevant to the orthopaedic surgeon. Firstly when to operate and what should be done to get the patient ready for theatre. In addition key aspects of peri-operative care will be discussed.

Regarding intracapsular fractures there is continuing controversy between preserving the femoral head using internal fixation or replacing the femoral head with a prosthesis. The suggested indications for these different methods of treatment will be discussed along with what is considered the most appropriate implants. Included within the talks will be details of surgical tips and techniques, designed to be of practical value for the orthopaedic surgeon.

For extracapsular hip fractures the debate is not just between intra versus extramedullary fixation. There have been a number of recent modifications to the Sliding Hip Screw. In addition notable differences exist between the different intramedullary nails. These developments will be discussed along with surgical techniques.

The recent development of the National Hip Fracture Audit and more recently the Hip Fracture Tariff means that all hospitals are under increasing scrutiny for their care of hip fracture patients. Surgeons need to be aware as to what is necessary to achieve this best practice tariff.

The meeting will also include practical demonstrations by world experts on some modern implants used for the surgical treatment of hip fractures. Included within this will be the recently introduced Targon FN plate. This implant is designed to provide additional stability to the fracture after internal fixation of an intracapsular hip fracture. The early results of this implant suggest it results in a significantly reduced risk of fracture healing complications when compared to more traditional methods of fixation.
